Media Agreement and Liability Release

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Presenters are at the cutting edge of making religion relevant today where work meets faith. The relevance is found in stories of loving authentically in one’s work, and having charity in the truth of one’s work. Every person has a gift or talent innately planted in their heart and mind. Faith grows when God bestows extreme value for the common good thru our gift or talent. Unlike a gift or talent used solely to benefit one’s self, God’s gift is always outwardly directed for the common good. Our task is to increase awareness of the gift and God’s preciousness, so God does not go unnoticed, unmarked, without God’s proper honor.

One way to do this is to publish media arising out of presentations including but not limited to articles, audios and videos (hereafter called “Media”). All Media is owned by Loquate, a not for profit organization.

The Media may be sponsored by individuals, groups and organizations (hereafter called “Sponsors”). Loquate offers a forum for speakers (hereafter called “Presenters”) to talk about their desire to love authentically (hereafter called “Presentation”).

Loquate’s hope is that the Media will continue on a self sustaining cost basis thru its partners. Partners include participants, volunteers, Presenters, Sponsors, local groups, advertising groups, website developers, video production groups, communication networks, and others (hereafter called “Partners”).

You may choose to publish or not. If you choose to publish, you agree to all aspects of this Media Agreement and Liability Release. If you do not agree, do not publish.

Here is a brief summary of the steps of video publication (hereafter termed “Publication”).

1) Loquate owns the media used in the Presentation.
2) Prior to Publication by Loquate, the Media may be edited by three parties: the Presenter, the Sponsor and Loquate; each party may solely in its discretion edit by deletion any portion(s) of the video, or deny Publication of the media.

3) Upon Publication by Loquate, the media will be considered a final edited version (hereafter called “THE MEDIA”).

Miracles of the Second Pentecost

It is far easier to promote something that already exists, than to promote something you are trying to create. The Second Pentecost is already upon us, but no sharing is like “Miracles – First hand.” It was the miracles of the first Pentecost from the Power of the Holy Spirit that permitted the Church to grow! Such stories abound, but are not told often enough. Satan will be conquered by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of the Laity in their miracle testimony to the power of the Holy Spirit.

We need to be careful about a language downgrade of a miracle. Let me give you an example. After a Ministry meeting, everyone left, except 3 of us - a member, Fr. Piotr and I, the member smelled roses. A rose is a symbol of the Blessed Mother. There were no roses present. That was a miracle for the member. It did not come to our attention until we saw him searching in the room. We asked what he was doing. He said he smelled roses. There were none. Neither Fr. Piotr nor I smelled the roses. But the member did and he

spoke up. It was clear he believed. So we believed too.

Every person has a miracle story. Belief in a caring presence outside of ourselves gives proof. That proof increases interior faith, when the miracle story is told. Every person of faith has a miracle story...or they would not be a person of faith. When we say “Oh, he is a man of great faith,” we mean something happened to that person that we can see exteriorly and know something unusual happened. When St. Francis kissed the leper, others clearly saw something from God and said he was a fool for God.

We live in a time of a cultural block to talking about God. The blockade is from Satan. I am continually thinking will this person be able to hear me. Satan is the one who places the cultural block before us. Another block is false charity: “You can’t be sure it was the Holy Spirit. Be cultural. If you must speak of it, use language that lets others decide.”

Our trust in the Holy Spirit is what makes a miracle. How we live our life is our testimony to our miracle. Giving witness to the miracle drives out Satan. So unless we talk about the private miracles, *as miracles*, that we see in our own lives, we cannot give witness to the Holy Spirit. By calling it a miracle, we give witness to the Holy Spirit. No language downgrade.

In today’s culture it feels like I have to be willing to be rejected when I talk about the Holy Spirit. Not so in “Miracles – First Hand.” We can share and we can hear others share. As we are uplifted, then we go forth and share the Good News with other believers. They join us. They come to our

next “Miracles - First Hand.” Before you know it, the Second Pentecost is upon us.

Do you know anyone to invite to attend? Ask them to think about it. Can they think of a miracle story to share? There is no such thing as a miracle story too small. If we do not give witness to the Holy Spirit, the power of the Holy Spirit still exists internally. But if we give witness to the Holy Spirit, He will bless all who hear.

The Second Pentecost is upon us. All we need do is to give witness to the Holy Spirit Who Alone brings about the miracles.

There is no witness like “Miracles – First Hand!”
