"We were born to live in community. Men of goodwill realize that it is only in the moment that one can become a person of goodwill doing the will of God bringing the kingdom of Heaven upon earth.

2. This invincibility manifests itself when we share a concern about our handling of some God thing at work. Others share relevant resolution stories, which becomes powerful interdependence based on the Spirit. By reviewing a chosen best practice for primary values that satisfy [scientifically proven](#) innate needs, you learn to comply with Natural Law, a safeguard from the Spirit.
3. This leads to happiness or joy for yourself, and increased sense of community in every group of which you are a part.
