About the Spirit We need to be open to the Spirit to recognize the Spirit. The Spirit is a caring presence outside of ourselves that can be invited to reside within ourselves. The Spirit is attracted to us by our surrender to the Spirit in faith. But we cannot get around having to change our self.

A process of deep devotion includes both Christian Ecumenism and Interfaith Dialogue, not based on shared beliefs.

You need permission from no one to do good for everyone:

For Buddhists: “Teach this truth to all: A generous heart, kind speech and a life of service and compassion are the things which renew humanity.”

For Hindus: “May we resolve to dedicate our life to the service of humankind, and uplift them to Divinity.” (Hindu-Yajur Veda)

For Jews: Isaiah 57:19 I offer peace to all, both near and far! I will heal my people.

For Christians: Ephesians 2:17-18 17 So Christ came and preached the Good News of peace to all—to you Gentiles, who were far away from God, and to the Jews, who were near to him. 18 It is through Christ that all of us, Jews and Gentiles, are able to come in the one Spirit into the presence of the Father.

There is truth in every strain of religion. We call this Interfaith Dialogue. When the

process is called Ecumenism, the process is a direction to Christ, Biblical Christ, as our Capstone. There are no meetings, no money, just a spiritual direction of “unity for all” called The Least.
