Ephesians 4:13

John 13:34-35

"And now I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. If you have love for one another, then everyone will know that you are my disciples."

Pray for your Enemies:

Matthew 5:44-45

"But now I tell you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may become the children of your Father in heaven."

Primary value attaining a goal satisfies innate need of competence. If you live this primary value in all cases in unity with all mankind, you satisfy your innate need for competence. But to do this, prayer to the caring presence outside of yourself is essential. Being in communion with the transcendent deepens your faith path.

Repent:

Matthew 4:<u>17</u>

From that time Jesus began to preach his message: "Turn away from your sins, because the Kingdom of heaven is near!"

Change yourself from ways that hurt and harm others, to more loving ways. Makes yourself small that God might be big. Still flourish as a human being by operating in your area of meaningful expansion for yourself. Each has work to do from all eternity that only that person can do. Satisfies innate need for autonomy. Do this in community betterment with all mankind.

Believe that Jesus is in the Father:

John 14:11

"Believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me. If not, believe because of the things I do." Understand a caring presence exists outside of ourselves. Share miracles first hand. Only the power of the Spirit provides miracles. Build Spirit-centered community. Join Loquate.

Take up your Cross and Follow Me:

Matthew 16:24-25

Go and Make Disciples:

Matthew 28:18-20

Jesus drew near and said to them, "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. Go, then, to all peoples everywhere and make them my disciples: baptize them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and teach them to obey everything I have commanded you. And I will be with you always, to the end of the age."

Free will is given to everyone. Have faith in every person to do the next right thing. Spread the presence of God within you by sharing your miracles first hand. Only the power of the Spirit brings miracles. Make your testimony. This evolves into faith in God, Who alone can accomplish all things.

Pray Always:

Luke 21:36

"Be on watch and pray always that you will have the strength to go safely through all those things that will happen and to stand before the Son of Man."

Prayer calms everything down and makes plain God's will for us to satisfy our innate needs and to empower all around us to satisfy their innate needs. By our example changing only our self we inevitably change behaviorally sociological system of which we are a part empowering others to do the same. Empower others to satisfy their innate needs, even when they may thwart our innate needs. This will satisfy your innate need for relatedness by the primary value of doing that which is truly in the best interests of others.
